Students must aim to earn 66% or more of all coursework they register for at Salem State University (exclude transfer credits).

Credits Attempted Include:

Courses with earned credit and courses without earned credits: Incompletes, NG's, W grades, repeated courses that are not counting towards GPA.

Understanding Financial Aid Satisfactory Academic Progress Calculations

All attempted and earned credits are used in the cumulative 66% progression (pace) calculation, including transfer credits. Only GPA earned at Salem State will be considered in the SAP calculation. Students who have attempted more than 180 credits have exceeded their maximum allowable aid for their undergraduate career, having attempted 150% of the credits required for graduation without having completed their programs.

Financial Aid SAP Appeals

Students may only appeal their loss of financial aid one time in their undergraduate career. Students will need to complete a self-assessment form, a SAP appeal form and an academic improvement plan with a professional advisor. If an appeal is approved, the student will maintain aid eligibility for the upcoming semester, but are required to maintain a semester GPA of 2.0 and a semester progression (pace) of 66% each semester they remain on SAP Probation or lose their aid eligibility until they are able to achieve positive SAP status. Visit Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) for complete information on financial aid appeals. Approval of appeals is not guaranteed and is based on an assessment of the ability of the student to restore their status to >=2.0 cumulative GPA and >=66% progression (pace) rate or to complete all academic requirements in a reasonable timeframe.

Important Note: Students failing the 150% Rule are not eligible to submit an appeal of the loss of financial aid.
