

What is Learning Modality?

Learning modality is the academic way of describing how (delivery mode) and when (convening method) your class will meet.

Delivery Mode

Describes how your professor will teach and how content will be delivered.

- o Delivery mode is organized into three categories:
 1. **Face-to-Face:** In-person only – nothing online
 2. **Online:** No in-person meetings
 3. **Hybrid:** Mix of in-person and virtual through Zoom

Convening Method

Describes whether your entire class will meet at the same time.

- o Occurrence is organized into three categories:
 1. **Synchronous** - Your entire class and professor regularly meets together at a scheduled date and time
 2. **Asynchronous** - You don't have a scheduled date and time to regularly meet as entire class
 3. **Blended** - A mix of synchronous and asynchronous meeting dates/times

Mode tells you if your course will be held on campus or online or a mix of both.

Typically, hybrid asynchronous classes will meet for fewer hours in person than standard in person classes, with more out of class work required.</p>	<p><i>Mix of In-Person and Online</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your class will have scheduled in-person meetings that meet for less time than a regularly scheduled fully in-person class • You will have more out of class work that you do according to your own schedule, subject to deadlines and due dates set by your professor. 	<p><i>Online</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When coursework is online, you don't need to meet as an entire class (asynchronous). This hybrid modality is described as online, asynchronous. <p><i>In-Person</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When you are scheduled to meet in-person, you'll physically be in a classroom with your professor and classmates at the same time. (synchronous). This hybrid modality is described as face-to-face, synchronous.

<p>Hybrid Synchronous (HYBS)</p> <p>Student learning occurs both in scheduled in-person class meetings during specific published times and locations, and in synchronous online class meetings during specific published times. Typically, hybrid synchronous classes will meet for fewer hours in person than standard in person classes, but will have required online class meetings.</p>	<p>Mix of In-Person and Online</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your class will have scheduled in-person meetings that meet for less time than a regularly scheduled fully in-person class You will also have required online classes held at specific times where you are expected to be in attendance. 	<p>Online Synchronous</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The online portion of the class will meet at a specific time, usually through videoconference (e.g., zoom). This hybrid modality is described as online synchronous. <p>In-Person</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> When you are scheduled to meet in-person, you'll physically be in a classroom with your professor and classmates at the same time. (synchronous). This hybrid modality is described as face-to-face, synchronous.
<p>Online, Asynchronous (WWW)</p> <p>Student learning occurs exclusively online, asynchronously; no convenings of the entire class; student engagement with the faculty member occurs as requested via a digital platform. There will be no prescheduled meeting times either online or in-person.</p>	<p>Online Only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No in-person meetings. All of your coursework is online. You do not need to physically be on campus to complete this course. 	<p>Asynchronous Only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No scheduled day or time to regularly meet as a class with your professor and classmates. You will most likely work independently. You are still responsible for submitting work by deadlines and due dates set by your professor.
<p>Online, Blended (BL)</p> <p>Student learning occurs primarily online, asynchronously, but with prescheduled synchronous in-virtual convenings of the entire class (i.e., Zoom).</p>	<p>Online Only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Your class will have scheduled online meetings that meet for less time than a regularly scheduled fully in-person class, usually via videoconference (e.g. zoom) You will have more out of class work that you do according to your own schedule, subject to deadlines and due dates set by your professor. You do not need to physically be on campus to complete this course. 	<p>Asynchronous</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> No scheduled day or time to regularly meet as a class with your professor and classmates. You will most likely work independently. This blended modality is described as online, asynchronous. <p>Synchronous</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will meet online with your entire class on scheduled dates and times. These will be outlined in your syllabus. This blended modality is described as online, synchronous.
<p>Online, Synchronous (SO)</p> <p>Student learning occurs exclusively online, during regularly scheduled predetermined days and times, for which instructor and students are virtually present throughout (i.e., Zoom).</p>	<p>Online Only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All scheduled class meetings will be held online, typically via videoconference. You do not need to physically be on campus to complete this course. 	<p>Synchronous Only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will regularly meet online as an entire class on scheduled dates and times.
<p>Hy-Flex (HYFLEX)</p> <p>Classes listed as Hy-Flex will have students attending both online and in person, using technology that allows all participants to interact, regardless of physical location.</p>	<p>Mix of Online and in Person</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will either be attending scheduled classes in person at a scheduled time and location on campus, or attending classes at a scheduled time via videoconference (e.g., zoom) Students registering for Hy-Flex sections should not assume they will be attending solely online. In-person attendance may be required. 	<p>Synchronous</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will regularly meet as an entire class on scheduled dates and times.
